1. Basketball is one of the most **popular** games in the world. People play it in most countries. It is a good game for rich or poor, and some basketball players have become rich from playing the game. Some people think it is a very old game but the basketball people play today is quite new.
2. Dr. James A. Naismith invented basketball in America in 1891. He invented it because he wanted a game people could play inside or outside, in the daytime or at night. He wanted it to be a team game and one that both men and women would like and could learn easily. He wanted it to be exciting to watch and to play. He wanted the players to use a ball, but not a bat. The ball had to be large and light. He wanted it to be easy to catch and throw, but not easy to hide. The winning team would be the team that could throw the ball the most times through a high basket. It is from the word "basket" the game got **its** name. In Naismith's game there were only 13 rules, but these changed many times until 1934. In that year, people stopped changing the rules.

TEXT 3

1. Sophia Fowler Gallaudet was the deaf wife of Thomas Hopkins Gallaudet, who founded the first permanent public school for the deaf in Hartford, Connecticut. She did not allow her deafness to prevent her from leading a full life. She was educated, raised a family, ran a busy household, and helped to found Gallaudet College.

Sophia Fowler was born deaf near Guilford, Connecticut, on March 20, 1798. At that time, there were no schools for the deaf in America. However, Sophia had a good mind. She used her intellect and learned many skills by watching the people around her. She learned to cook and sew, and became a modest, gay and **charming** young lady.

2. Sophia was nineteen years old when her parents learned that a school for the deaf had been founded in Hartford, Connecticut. She entered the school in 1817 and stayed there until the spring of 1821. While she was there, the principal of the school, Thomas Hopkins Gallaudet fell in love with her and asked her to marry him. Sophia did not hesitate, and married him in 1821.

3. As Mrs. Gallaudet, she continued to charm the people she met. She was eager to learn from every social situation. Through her contact with the many visitors to her home, she was actually able to continue her education.

4. Thomas Hopkins Gallaudet died in 1851, leaving his wife to make a life without him. However, her eight children did not leave her without support. With the help of her grown children, she continued to keep house for those children that had not yet married.

5. In 1857, Mrs. Gallaudet's youngest son, Edward Miner Gallaudet, became principal of the Columbia Institution for the Deaf in Washington, D.C. **He** was only 20 years only at the time, but his ambition was to establish a college for the deaf. His mother shared his dream and work. She often met with members of Congress and other prominent men in order to gain support for her goals. she helped to obtain funds to found and maintain Gallaudet College.

6. Mrs. Gallaudet served as matron of the Columbia Institution for the Deaf (now Kendall Demonstration School and Gallaudet College) for nine years. This included two years as head of the department that taught many of the household skills that she had learned as a child, such as cooking and sewing. She retired only when her health began to fail.

7. During her last years, Mrs. Gallaudet spent the winters in Washington, D.C., and the rest of the year traveling and visiting her children and grandchildren. She died on May 13, 1877. Gallaudet has preserved her memory by naming Fowler Hall, which was originally a women's dormitory and is now part of the graduate school, in her honor.

1. Being a student in a school or college is not the best situation in regard to health. There is very little physical activity in a classroom, and homework often requires one or more hours of sitting down. If this routine is continued for fifteen weeks or more, your body is not as strong as it was when you arrived.
2. Studying makes people mentally tired. [A] This may cause them to eat more food than the body requires. Since your body does not need this food, you could gain too much weight. Also you are not getting the proper exercise. **This** causes the muscles to become weak.
3. A weak person may become tired by twelve noon and not learn effectively in the afternoon. Also a weak person does not have the fast reactions for many things that may be required. For example, a pilot may be required to do as many as eight movements in a few seconds. Even though a pilot may know these movements, he may not react as fast as he should. Therefore, it is for the benefit of the **individual** not to allow his stay at the school or college to weaken him physically.
4. The best advice is to try to do some physical activity each day. Students should check out athletic equipment and play baseball, volleyball, or ping-pong. [B] Walking is also very good. You should visit the gymnasium regularly. Even a few push-ups every morning help the muscles keep in shape for the day.
5. Also it is good to check your weight every few days. If you are gaining weight, perhaps you should skip eating the dessert. If you are losing weight, perhaps you are not getting enough sleep and are not eating any breakfast. [C] It always helps to know how your body may be adjusting to a new situation.
6. If you are sick, do not try to cure yourself. Check out at a hospital and see a doctor. Do not wait hoping that a fever or headache may go away. It is always good to see a doctor when you have an ailment. **It** may be very serious and need immediate medical attention.
7. Do not cook or have food in your room. Food spoils easily if it is not in a refrigerator. Certain kinds of food become very poisonous when they spoil. [D]
